When you get this Christmas will have come and gone. I hope that everyone had a safe and enjoyable Christmas and New Years!

Speaking of New Years, many people try to make New Year's Resolutions to change or improve various situations in their life. As we begin a new year in the life of our radio club I would like to challenge everyone to think about the direction and goals of where we as a club are headed in the next year. What things do we need to change or make improvements in?

I recently received the January 2020 issue of QST. On page 9, ARRL CEO Howard E. Michel, WB2ITX, writes the following in his Second Century column:

"The world has changed. People are busy with many activities — establishing careers, building families, giving back to their communities. Free time is scarce. People are used to customization. They expect to engage the world on their own terms, on their own schedule, and in their own way. Younger hams are not just younger versions of you and me. They have grown up in a different world. ...We can try to mold the future generation of hams to our image, or we can embrace new hams for what they are. ARRL needs to do the latter."

He further writes about how ARRL will seek to change its focus: "Our focus will be on developing ways, and an infrastructure, that members can use to organize themselves in ways they want, to do thing that they consider meaningful. I can see these new clubs organized to support special events, such as a marathon; to engage in STEM education; or prepare for disasters. These types of clubs exist now, but they many need to conform to a set of rules designed for traditional clubs."

In this new year, I would like for our club to consider how we can reach younger hams and extend the growth of this wonderful club by becoming a Special Service Club. According to ARRL, "A special program exists to recognize those clubs who do more than the usual for their communities and for Amateur Radio. These well-rounded groups are the Special Service Clubs (SSCs). SSCs are the leaders in their Amateur Radio communities. They're the ones with the active training classes, the publicity program and the members who actively pursue technical projects and operating activities."

At our January meeting I will share some additional information on how we can become a Special Services Club and the requirements that are needed. I hope to see everyone at the next meeting. Until then, "73's everyone!".

ARRL West Texas Ham of the Year Award

At the West Texas Convention in March 2019 during my remarks I mentioned that I was instituting a West Texas Ham of the Year Award. The award will be presented at the West Texas Convention, Midland Texas during the March 2020 Hamfest.

Below is the nomination format I'd like you to use in nominating someone for the award. Nominations may be made using the outline below on a plain sheet of paper.

Nominations should be legible and accurately spell out why the person being nominated deserves to be the 2020 West Texas Ham of the Year.

I will appoint a nominating committee who will review the received nominations and make recommendations for the award. The nominating committee will be composed of our SEC, a DEC and a randomly chosen club member from a West Texas radio club.

Nominating Committee members and ARRL office holders are not eligible for this award.

NOMINATION CRITERIA

SPECTRUM AT RISK by Dale Durham, W5WI

Folks,

I posted information about this a few weeks ago. This is a reminder to let your voice be heard if you haven't done so already. Our spectrum is our most valuable asset in ham radio. We must not let it be chipped away without a fight!

FCC Formally Adopts Proposals to Remove Amateur 3-GHz Band, Invites Comments

At its December 12 meeting, the FCC formally adopted a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM) in WT Docket 19-348 and invited comments on its plan to remove "existing non-federal secondary radiolocation and amateur allocations" in the 3.3 – 3.55 GHz band and relocate incumbent non-federal operations. The FCC said it's seeking comment on appropriate "transition mechanisms" to make that happen.

ARRL has indicated that it will file comments in opposition to the proposal. The amateur 9-centimeter allocation is 3.3 - 3.5 GHz

While I know many of you do not personally use the 3.5 GHz band, Many of the clubs and

organizations in larger Metropolis areas do use this band,

They use it to help protect you and I during Severe Weather by the way of Mesh Networks known as AREDN, you may live in an area where 3.5 GHz is in use by fellow amateurs to help protect you, your loved ones and your property and not even know it.

There are several ways you can help prevent this.....
